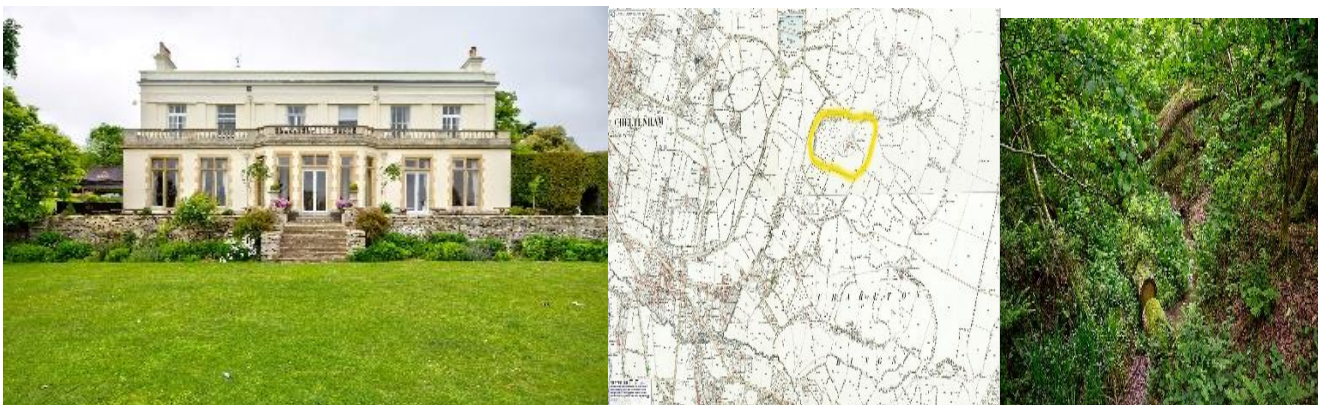

Glenfall House (in Mill Lane) started out as a simple c1770 farmhouse that became a *cottage orné* which is defined by English Heritage as “a rustic building of picturesque design”. An early owner enlarged it, added a carriage drive, a lodge and landscaped the grounds, including the waterfall. In the 1920s the drawing room and dining room were extended and a large ballroom with a sprung floor added. More about its fascinating history can be found at:
