The shift patterns for Police Officers and Police Community Support Officers will be aligned in order to give greater support to each other and to their respective communities; providing a more visible presence and better service in our area, which will now comprise Charlton Kings, Fairview, Lansdown, Leckhampton, Tivoli and the Town Centre. We look forward to working with our new team of 4 Police Constables and 7 PCSOs under the leadership of Sgt Steve Benbow

**As police resources are allocated according to the number of incidents being reported, it is vital that you make sure that they know about incidents that do not warrant a 999 call by ringing 101 or using the electronic form on the Constabulary website which can be found at <https://www.gloucestershire.police.uk>** At the top right of their home page is a link to REPORT A CRIME OR INCIDENT. This automatically allocates an incident reference number and puts the details onto the controller's computer screen.

**Asset Stickers** The Parish Council spends a great deal of our Precept, your money, on purchasing new items for public benefit and enjoyment. So that people have a better idea about some of the things we do, we have developed adhesive labels that tell residents that the Parish Council has bought and is maintaining a diverse range of items. These include bus



shelters, grit bins, outdoor gym equipment and the defibrillator; and we have recently labelled the specimen trees that we have had planted in Newcourt Green, Old Pat's playing field and later this year in the Beeches. **For more information contact the Parish Office.**
